<p>POSITION SUMMARY</p>	<p>Sartori is seeking experienced commercial boat operators, preferably with Small Vessel Operating Proficiency (SVOP), or higher class certification under the <i>Canada Shipping Act</i>, to aid in delivery of a Marine Mammal Monitoring Program for construction of a marine terminal at Woodfibre, on Howe Sound, near Squamish BC. The terminal is part of the Woodfibre LNG Project.</p> <p>Boat(s) will be provided by Sartori, will be less than 9m (27') length, appropriate to local weather/sea conditions, and rigged for safe operation.</p> <p>Boat operators will be responsible for safe operation of boats to provide access for Marine Mammal Observers and environmental technicians to conduct visual observations for marine mammals, deploy sensitive monitoring equipment, and conduct water quality monitoring. Daily trips will be short in distance, but will require long hours at sea.</p> <p>Camp facilities will be available for non-local candidates, daily transportation to/from project site from Squamish will be available for local candidates.</p> <p>Position likely to require extended shifts followed by extended time off (e.g. 10 days on – 4 days off; 7 days on – 7 days off, etc.). Normal working days are likely to be up to 10 hours.</p>
